Rev. Tadeusz Pacholczyk, Ph.D.



Rev. Dr. Tadeusz Pacholczyk is a priest of the diocese of Fall River, Massachusetts. He has undergraduate degrees in philosophy, biochemistry, molecular cell biology and chemistry; he later earned his Ph.D. in Neuroscience from Yale University. Fr. Tad has worked for several years as a molecular biologist at Massachusetts General Hospital/ Harvard Medical School. He studied for five years in Rome, doing advanced work in dogmatic theology and in bioethics. He has testified before several state legislatures during deliberations over stem cell research and cloning. In addition to giving presentations and participating in roundtables on bioethics, he also provides media commentaries to major news outlets. Fr. Tad is the Director of Education for The National Catholic Bioethics Center in Philadelphia.

Matt Bowman



Matt Bowman knows firsthand that bioethics has real-world consequences in people's lives and in the law. He serves as legal counsel with the Alliance Defense Fund in Washington, D.C., where he is a key member of the Life Litigation Project to protect the sanctity of human life. He is admitted to the bar in Michigan, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Supreme Court, and various lower federal courts. Bowman earned his J.D. from Ave Maria School of Law in 2003. He will explore several tragic and sometimes heroic situations of people who found their lives pushed to the brink because of society's transgressions away from traditional Christian views on bioethics and sexuality. He will also tell how the Alliance Defense Fund is using the Truth in courts of law to help restore human rights and dignity to people in need.

Eddie Cotter, Jr. manages the day to day operations of the Dead Theologians Society, serving as the apostolate's Executive Director. He is a founder of the apostolate and represents DTS to the public. Eddie has 17 years of active youth ministry experience and has worked with teens in one capacity or another since he was a teen himself. Eddie has been a guest several times on the EWTN's *Life on the Rock* program and is a regular contributor to Relevant Radio's *Morning Air*. Eddie, his wife and their two teenagers live in the Diocese of Madison, WI.
